1 Introduction

Issue 82 proposes to make the *ac-value-list* in an array constructor optional, providing a natural notation to construct zero-size arrays. It also proposes to require a *type-spec* in all cases that the constructor produces a zero-size array; this would invalidate Fortran 90 programs, and is therefore rejected.

2 Edits
