1 Discussion

In issue 202, the editor asks whether a procedure declaration statement is the correct entity to which to impute specification of characteristics of a procedure pointer, rather than to an interface block, and whether the word “previous” is appropriate. The procedure declaration statement is the correct specification, and “previous” is not appropriate.

2 Edits
